


Acer ginnala--Amur Maple

Hardiness Zones: 2 to 8

Height: 20 ft Spread: 20 ft Form: rounded

Type: small deciduous tree

Annual Growth Rate: less than 12 inches

Comments:

Amur Maple is an excellent, low growing tree for small yards. It develops naturally into a multi-stemmed clump but can be trained to a single trunk. The pink to red fruit clusters in summer are followed by yellow to red foliage color in the fall. Amur Maple is a hardy tree that tolerates poor soil and may be used in hedges or screens.
