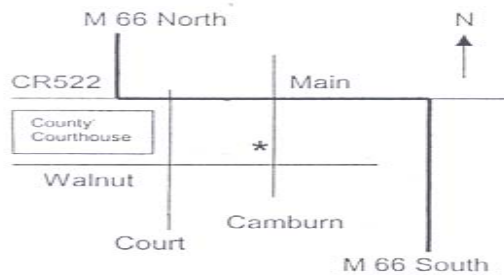
Lakeview: 4th Wednesday of the Month - 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. - High School Parking Lot, 9800 N. Youngman Road

Full Service Mobile Recycle Centers

Preserving our community and our environment through recycling



A FREE service funded by Montcalm County Solid Waste Committee.

Services contracted with Goodwill Industries.

Montcalm County is providing all residents with an alternative direction for recyclable materials that might otherwise be disposed of in a landfill. The items accepted at the recycle centers will be processed and delivered to manufacturing plants to make new products saving landfill space and preserving our environment.

How It Works:

Consider whether the item you are throwing into the trash can be recycled. On the scheduled day, bring your cleaned materials to the recycle center in your area. Locations and hours are listed on the back. Attendants will be at the locations to accept and sort the items.

What Can You Recycle?

Paper

This includes newspapers, paper bags, office paper, magazines, gift wrap, corrugated cardboard boxes, etc.



Glass

This includes any type of clear household bottles or jars.



NOTE: We are unable to accept window glass, light bulbs, green or brown glass or any kind of ceramics.

Metal

Tin cans, aluminum and other metals, up to two feet in length, will be accepted at the recycle centers.



NOTE: Labels **DO NOT** need to be removed from tin cans, plastic or glass bottles

Plastic

Any plastic containers with the following symbols on them will be accepted. They are usually located on the bottom of the item.



PETE

PETE: Clear, transparent containers only. *Examples* - Many soft drink, water and mouthwash containers.



HDPE

HDPE: *Examples* - Milk jugs, soap, liquid detergent bottles, butter containers and grocery bags.



LDPE

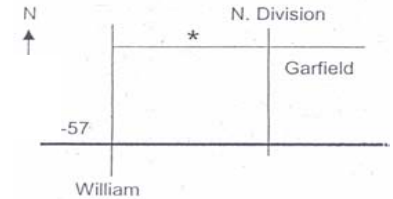
LDPE: *Examples* - Squeezable containers (e.g. honey or mustard containers) any type of bag ranging from clean bread wrappers to mattress bags.

~ All containers must be clean ~

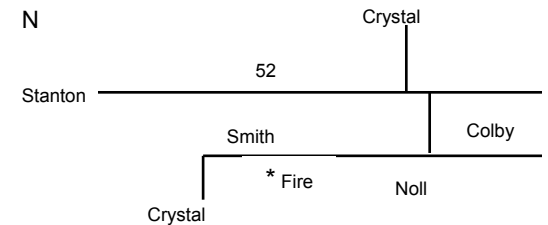
